

Large, blue-gray, paddle-shaped leaves provide a foil for this plant's sculptural flowers. While this plant takes a long time to flower indoors, doing so only when fully mature and well cared for, its gorgeous tropical blooms are worth the wait. Keep away from pets and children.

Light

This plant loves sun, so place near a south window or west window in a room with a lot of light.

High/Bright indirect.

Watering

Keep the potting soil moist in Spring and Summer; reduce in Fall and Winter; allowing the top of the potting soil to dry out between waterings. Place on a tray of wet pebbles or use a humidifier.

Feeding

Apply a balanced liquid fertilizer, diluted to 1/2 strength. We recommend Jack's® Classic All Purpose 20-20-20 every two weeks from Spring to Fall. Do NOT fertilize in winter.

Planting & Care

Grow with Black Gold® All Purpose soil.

Set in high light and provide good ventilation in Summer.

Replace the top potting soil layer annually; repot every 2 years in Spring.

Flower

Flowers are brightly colored and resemble the beak and head-feathers of a bird with many flowers coming from one plant.

Size

Mature plants can get 3-4 feet tall and 2-3 feet wide.
