

The Calathea 'White Fusion' cultivar, with its variegated shades of white, green, and lilac is a striking addition to the Calathea family. The top side of its leaves features contrasting white markings alongside the green, and the underside has a pretty light purple-pinkish hue that also runs down the stems.

They are often called 'prayer plants' because of their unique leaf movements: they raise and lower their leaves from day to night as part of their circadian rhythm. This phenomenon is called nyctinasty. Scientists theorize that these movements are meant to follow the sun and catch as much light as possible— an essential trait for a forest-floor-dwelling plant.

Light

Bright indirect-moderate

Watering

Keep the potting soil evenly moist, not wet, but never dry.

Do NOT use tap water, this will cause the edges of the leaves to become brown. We recommend filtered, distilled, or rainwater.

Feeding

Feed every 2 weeks during the growing season with a balanced houseplant fertilizer, such as Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food.

Planting & Care

Grow with Black Gold® All Purpose Soil amended with perlite or horticultural charcoal. Set in bright light, out of direct sun and drafts. They thrive best when provided with greenhouse-like conditions: warm, moist, gentle airflow.

These plants are grown for their beautiful foliage and most likely won't flower in the home.
