Light

Give this plant a bright light situation.

Bright indirect

Watering

Allow the top of the potting soil to dry out between waterings from Spring to Fall and keep barely moist in Winter. Ensure you do not overwater the plant, as the roots will rot in soggy conditions. Might have to place on a pebble tray to increase humidity.

Feeding

Apply a balanced liquid fertilizer (Jack's® Classic All Purpose 20-20-20) once a month in Spring and Summer.

Planting & Care

Grow with Black Gold® All Purpose soil or well draining soil with perlite in a pot that fits the root ball. Place in bright indirect light, away from direct sun and drafts. In Winter, move it away from heaters. Repot every 2-3 years when root-bound.

Size

In its natural habitat, this plant can be a large tree. In the home, it can be 5-10 feet tall and 4-6 feet wide and more if you have room.



Flower

Most likely it will not have flowers or fruit in the home.
