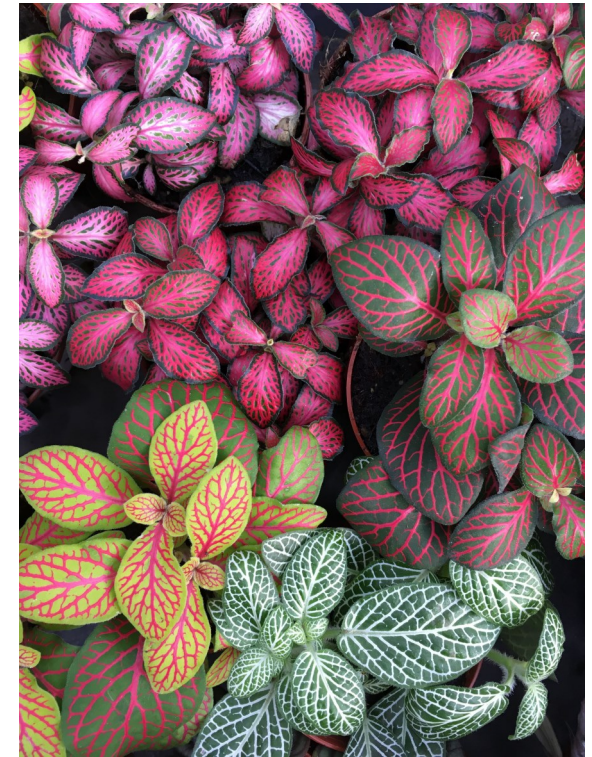


Each leaf of fittonia plant is a living work of art. Against the background of deep olive green, leaf veins of white, pink, or green branch and flow in symmetrical patterns.

Although the most popular vein color is white, you can also find pinks, reds, and greens. Nerve plant is a low-growing creeper that is perfect for terrariums or bottle gardens.

## Light

As a tropical plant, it grows in the humid bright shade. It dislikes full sunlight, preferring bright, indirect sun, such as that offered by a north-facing window. It will also thrive under fluorescent lights.

## Watering

Keeping the plant appropriately moist can be a challenge. Fittonia is prone to collapse if it's allowed to dry out. Although it will recover quickly if thoroughly watered, repeated fainting spells will eventually take their toll on the plant. Oppositely, Fittonia plants that are allowed to stagnate in water will develop yellowed, limp leaves. This plant **LOVES** humidity so place next to a humidifier or on a tray of wet pebbles.

## Feeding

Apply a balanced houseplant food monthly during growing season from Spring to Fall. We recommend Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food.

## Planting & Care

Grow in peaty potting soil like Black Gold® All Purpose Mix.

Repot annually in the spring or as needed to rearrange plants in a dish garden or terrarium.



## Size

This creeper only gets 3-6" high and 12-18" wide.

## Flower

It has insignificant yellow or red flowers, but most likely not in the house. If they do appear pinch them off, because they will weaken the show of leaves.

## Temperature

65-75°F

Keep away from drafts in winter.
