Light

The plain green varieties can tolerate low-light levels but prefer a medium to bright light if the plant has variegation.

Bright indirect/Medium light

Watering

Evenly moist soil is best for ivy, never allow the plant to sit in water. Let the soil dry slightly (top 1/2 inch) before watering again. When you do water your ivy, take it to the sink and rinse the leaves off also, this helps to deter spider mites.

Feeding

Apply a balanced liquid fertilizer (Espoma® Organic Indoor Liquid Organic Plant Food) every 2 weeks from Spring to Fall.

Planting & Care

Plant your ivy in a well drained potting medium. We recommend Black Gold All Purpose Potting Mix amended with perlite or horticultural charcoal for added drainage.
