## Light

Monstera can tolerate low light, but would prefer a medium to bright light. In their native habitat, they start life on the jungle floor and scramble along until they find a tree to cling to then climb to the top for light.

## Watering

Water thoroughly and then let the top 1" of soil dry out before watering again.

## Feeding

Feed monthly during the growing season with a balanced houseplant fertilizer, such as Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food.

## Planting & Care

Grow with Black Gold® All Purpose soil amended with horticultural charcoal, orchid bark, or perlite. This Monstera prefers 'loose' not compacted soil so oxygen can get to its roots.

## Size

Up to 6 feet in the home.

## Temperature

65-80°F

## Humidity

Moderate, but like any tropical plant does like higher humidity levels
