# RAINBOW PEPEROMIA



## Light

They prefer medium to bright light, which is especially important if the plant is variegated.

Bright indirect/Medium

## Watering

Allow the top 1 inch of soil to dry out before watering, these plants would prefer to be on the dryer side.

Do NOT allow the plant to sit in water.

## Feeding

During the growing season, feed monthly with a houseplant fertilizer. In the winter feed monthly. We recommend Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food

## Planting & Care

Use a well draining potting mix, we recommend Black Gold Cactus Mix amended with horticultural charcoal.

Peperomia's need some air around their roots, they don't like the soil to be tightly packed around them. They also like to be a bit pot bound.

## Flower

The flowers are a long, skinny 2- to 3-inch-long spike resembling a rat tail. They are natural to the plant but hardly "attractive".

## Size

Rarely taller than 12 inches
