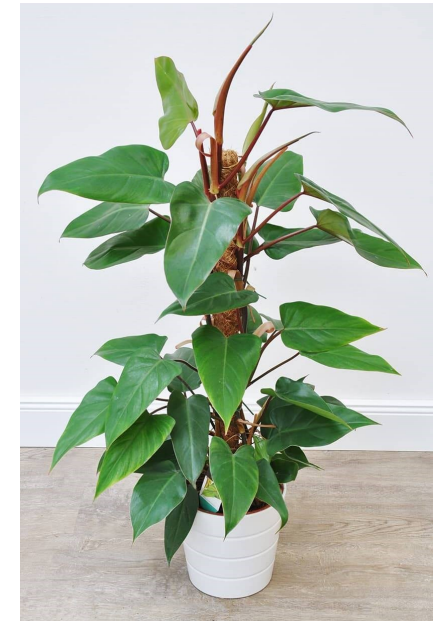


An old favorite, this Philodendron is a determined climber with elongated heart-shaped leaves. Easy to grow in a warm, brightly lit room, climbing philodendrons can reach 6 feet in height over several years. It **MUST** be trained to a post, which can be coco coir covered or moss covered. The plant cannot attach itself with out help.

Light

In the summer provide bright indirect light. In winter, moderate light.

Medium light-bright indirect

Watering

From spring to fall keep the soil lightly moist at all times. In winter allow the top 1" of soil to dry out before watering. Especially in winter, mist moss/coco choir covered support pole to provided moisture for aerial roots.

Feeding

Feed from spring through fall with a balanced houseplant fertilizer. We recommend Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food. In winter, feed every 6 weeks.

Planting & Care

Any peaty soil that drains well, we recommend Black Gold® or Espoma® African Violet Soil amended with horticultural charcoal. They benefit from a occasional leaf cleaning/wiping. Repot in the spring until the plant fills a 12" pot. When repotting, keep the plant attached to its support pole.

Up to 6 feet on a pole.

It is grown for its foliage.
