Light

Bright indirect-Medium

Watering

Keep it evenly moist, but NOT soggy. Water when the top of the soil feels dry. If left to get to dry, it will drop its leaves.

Feeding

Apply a houseplant fertilizer such as Espoma Organic Indoor Houseplant Food, every 2 week during the spring and summer. Apply monthly during the fall and do not fertilize during winter.

Planting & Care

Grow this plant in a well draining peat based mix, we recommend Black Gold African Violet Soil.

Repot every few years, pinch back growth as needed to maintain a bushy appearance.
