

This is the ultimate houseplant that almost every has or at least should have. This group of plants is an easy plant that can be kept under control with trimming. Its tolerance to low-light situations is definitely a plus in the houseplant world. These plants are often used in office settings where the only light they receive is from fluorescent lights, and they do well.

SCINDAPSUS (SATIN "POTHOS")



Light

Bright indirect/Medium/Low

Watering

Allow the top of the potting soil to dry out between watering from Spring to Fall; in Winter keep barely moist. It will let you know it is dry when every leaf wilts over the edge of the pot. Yet it would be best if that never happens, as it will react by having some yellow leaves. Never let sit in standing water.



Feeding

Apply a balanced liquid fertilizer (Jack's® Classic All Purpose 20-20-20) monthly from Spring to Fall.

Planting & Care

Grow with Black Gold® All Purpose soil in a pot that will accommodate the root ball. Set in bright or low light, out of direct sun. If grown as a climber, tie stems to a moss pole or wires. Prune in Spring. Repot every 2 years, replace top layer of potting soil of mature plants each Spring.

Flower

This plant is grown for foliage and will not likely flower in your home.

Size

The vines can become 10-20 feet long if left untrimmed. It is better to keep your plant trimmed and full. Cut a few of the stems back to the soil line, and new sprouts will appear.
